The digital disruption spread across the world has stressed on the importance of good education managing the process of working in the future. Today, technology represents a way to foster economic development, improve levels of education and training, as well as address the emerging issues within society. Our country is promisingly poised to take advantage of this gathering storm of opportunity.



HIGHLIGHTS

A. ORGANIZATION MANDATE

National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), is an Autonomous Scientific Society under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. NIELIT is actively engaged in Capacity Building and Skill Development in the areas of Information Technology (IT); Electronics; Communication Technologies; Hardware; Cyber Law; Cyber Security; GIS; Cloud Computing; ESDM; e-Waste; IoT; Big Data; Block Chain; Data Analysis, e-Governance and related verticals. It offers courses both in the Formal as well as the Nonformal sectors and is also one of the National Examination Bodies which accredits institutes/ organizations for the conduct of courses in the Non-Formal Sector. NIELIT is also rolling out IT Literacy Programmes for many State Governments for its employees and the masses.

NIELIT is functioning under the overall control and guidance of the Governing Council. The Hon'ble Union Minister for Electronics and Information Technology (E&IT) is the Chairperson of the Council whereas Hon'ble MoS (E&IT) is the Deputy Chairperson with its members from Government, Industry, Academia and representatives of various professional bodies.

The **Management Board** of NIELIT is chaired by the Secretary, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. Each NIELIT Centre has an **Executive Committee** consisting of representatives from respective State Governments, academic institutions and industry for the effective implementation of the decisions of the Board and the Council.

The Finance & Accounts (F&A) Committee of NIELIT is chaired by the Director General, NIELIT and the Committee assists the Governing Council by recommending the Budget Estimates / Revised Estimates and other finance related matters. The Committee is also mandated to scrutinize the Audited Annual Accounts before its submission to the Governing Council for adoption, besides appointment of Auditors. Director General NIELIT is the Chief Executive Officer of the organization. He is supported by Registrar, CFO, CoE and Joint Directors of Technical Wing at HQs and Executive Directors/Directors at Centres level.

The Academic Advisory Committee (ACC) is chaired by an eminent Academician with its members drawn from Academic and Industries and is the Advisory Body on the academic activities of NIELIT.

The Vigilance department of NIELIT is headed by the **Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO)**, a senior officer from MeitY. The CVO is assisted by Vigilance Officers at all Centres and also at NIELIT Headquarters.

In order to promote transparency and accountability, mandatory provisions of the Right to Information Act (RTI) have been implemented in the Institute with effect from July 2005. The Public Information Officer (PIO) at Headquarters, as well as, PIOs at all NIELIT Centres have been appointed, as per the requirement spelled out under RTI Act. To deal with the requests under RTI Act, internal procedures have been formulated and the mandatory information has been hosted on the NIELIT website (www.nielit.gov.in). Registrar, NIELIT has been appointed as the First Appellate Authority under RTI Act. With a view to bring excellence in public service delivery and to redress grievances of citizens in a meaningful manner, NIELIT has also appointed a Public Grievance Officer (PGO), in line with the guidelines promulgated by Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances. The statutory instructions for use of Hindi are being complied in accordance with region wise locations of NIELIT Centres.

As on date, NIELIT has PAN-India presence through a network of 43 own Centres at Agartala, Aizwal, Ajmer



B. SKILL DEVELOPMENT, CAPACITY BUILDING AND EMPLOYABILITY

The National Policy on Skill Development is aimed towards empowering all individuals through improved skills, knowledge and nationally and internationally recognized qualifications to gain access to decent employment and to ensure India's competitiveness in the global market. NIELIT plays an important role for skilling of youth in the area of IECT, especially in rural sectors. The wide repertoire of NIELIT Courses includes: (a) Courses in the Formal Sector offered by the NIELIT Centres in association with State Universities/Technical Board such as ME/ M.Tech, BE/B.Tech, MCA, BCA programmes; Aurangabad Centre is also facilitating PhD Program in the area of Electronics (b) Courses in the Non Formal Sector in IT, Hardware, etc., under four levels, namely 'O' (NSQF Level 5); 'A' (NSQF Level 6); 'B' (NSQF Level 7); and 'C' (NSQF Level 8); (c) Short Term Courses in niche areas; and (d) IT Literacy Programmes for the proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country; besides specialized programmes in e-Governance, e-Waste etc. targeted towards empowering the employees of the State Governments. In addition, NIELIT has also created expertise for the roll out of customized skill development programmes, as per specific needs of public and private sector firms.

E. BUILDING AND INFRASTUCTURE OF NIELIT CAMPUSES DURING 2018-2019

With a vision to provide an excellent infrastructure with residential facilities for the benefit of the students from far flung areas, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India has approved the setting up of permanent campuses of NIELIT Centres in different parts of the country. Apart from MeitY approved projects for NIELIT Centres, NIELIT has also constructed its headquarters building with its own corpus funds. The new Centres have helped in expanding the NIELIT's reach to the remote areas where other institutes of good repute are not present in the areas of Electronics & Information Technology. Apart from setting up of permanent campuses, efforts are also made to set up Training Centres at remote areas under monitoring of respective NIELIT Centre at the state. The building projects completed/ongoing during 2018-19 are as follows:



Construction of a new NIELIT Centre at Pakyong, Sikkim: Under the Union Cabinet approved project "Development of NE Region by enhancing training/capacity in IECT area", the centre has been allotted 8.54 acres of land at Pacheykhani Block under Pakyong Sub Division by Government of Sikkim for construction of its permanent campus. The construction is in progress with over 50% work completed.



NIELIT Study Centre at Lakhanpura: Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad, Hon'ble Union Minister of Electronics & Information Technology and Law & Justice, Gol has adopted the village Lakhanpura of block Bakhtiyarpur, Patna



under second phase of Pradhan Mantri Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojna (PMSAGY) for skilling the youth of the village through IECT enabled courses.

In this endeavour, NIELIT Patna has opened a Adarsh computer Saksharta Kendra in the village which was inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister on 21st June, 2018. The newly opened computer Saksharta Kendra is equipped with modern multimedia classroom and computer lab. To facilitate local youth of the area, specially women candidates who are expected to enroll in various job oriented courses in the centre.

NIELIT Centre Kolkata – NIELIT Kolkata has started its activity from the new campus at Salt Lake, Kolkata since 1st October, 2018.





NIELIT Extension Centre Majuli: Hon'ble Union Minister for Information Technology and Law & Justice, Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad during a meeting with the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam, Shri Sarbarnanda Sonowal held on 30th July 2018 at Guwahati, announced the opening of a new NIELIT Centre at Majuli, Assam.







Thereafter with the help of Govt. of Assam and the District Administration, Majuli, NIELIT Guwahati identified and took possession of a rented built up space in Majuli. After necessary pre-commissioning formalities, the NIELIT's study centre at Majuli was made operational w.e.f 1st January 2019.

Construction/upgradation of permanent campuses in North East: In North East, 18 campuses were approved by Hon'ble Cabinet in 2012. Construction has started at 12 locations (Imphal, Senapati & Churachandpur in Manipur; Aizawl & Lunglei in Mizoram; Chuchuyimlang in Nagaland; Pasighat in Arunachal Pradesh; Tezpur, Kokrajhar, Jorhat, Dibrugarh in Assam and Gangtok in Sikkim).

NIELIT Extension Centre Buxar: On September 13, 2018, Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad, Hon'ble Union Minister of Electronics & Information Technology and Law & Justice, Gol laid the foundation of the Extension Centre of NIELIT to be built at the ground of I.T.I., Buxar in presence of Shri Nitish Kumar, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Bihar; Shri Sushil Kumar Modi, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister, Bihar; Shri Ashwini Kumar Choubey, Minister of State for Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India and Dr. Jaideep Kumar Mishra, Director General, NIELIT besides other dignitaries. The construction of the Extension Centre at the ground of ITI Buxar would have state of the art infrastructure with latest smart class rooms and labs, with a built-up area of approx 1000 Sq.M. Government of Bihar has provided one acre of land for establishment of the NIELIT Extension Centre at Buxar which for providing training in various long and short term courses.






NIELIT Extension Centre Mandi: The Extension Centre of Shimla has started its activities in the built up space provided by the State Govt. at MandavHotel, Mandi till the time a permanent campus is built. The centre has been inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh on 5th March 2019. NIELIT Shimla has already taken possession of land for building a permanent campus.







F. DIGITAL LITERACY



Digital India is a campaign launched by the Government of India to ensure the Government's services are made available to citizens electronically by improved online infrastructure and by increasing Internet connectivity or by making the country digitally empowered in the field of technology. Digital Literacy refers to an individual's ability to find, evaluate, produce and communicate clear information through various digital platforms such as smart phone, laptops, desktops etc. Digital Literacy helps people to use technology in complementing their daily routine and become more productive.

NIELIT as the HRD arm of MeitY, is making efforts to bridge the 'digital divide' through its IT Literacy Courses leading to employability of youth, especially for the marginalized section of the society. NIELIT has a range of Digital Literacy courses, namely Awareness in Computer Concepts (ACC – 20 Hours), Basic Computer Course (BCC – 36 Hours), Course on Computer Concept (CCC – 80 Hours), Course on Computer Concepts Plus (CCC Plus – 126 Hours), Expert

Computer Course (ECC – 200 Hours) which are recommended for effective proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country and many State Governments have also recognized these courses for employment/ promotion/increment purposes. The digital literacy courses of NIELIT especially, BCC/ CCC are accepted by the various State Governments/ Government Departments such as Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, O/o the CGA, DGE&T etc. for recruitment/inservice promotions/incentives etc.

G. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS/ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2018-2019:

Capacity Building in IT & Digital Services (including Digital Payments and GST):

The project with a target to train 10,000 State Government Officials on IT and Digital Services in North Eastern Region (NER) has been successfully completed by NIELIT. With the support of Ministry of DoNER (Development of North Eastern Region) and North East Council (NEC), the two weeks training programme was delivered through 320 batches by all NIELIT Centres located in the North East Region.

The objective of the project was to enhance IT skills of the Officials by providing them with





digital sills viz. Digital Literacy, e-Governance Services, GST Training and to facilitate regular use of IT and Digital Services as a way of life and especially in official work. A total of 616 Departments such Forest & Environment, Social Welfare, Handloom, Tourism, Community & Rural Development, Water Resources, Department of Personnel etc. have participated in the training programme. The programme received overwhelming response in all NE States.



2. Launch of Digital North East Vision 2022:

On 11th August, 2018 The Hon'ble Union minister for electronics & Information Technology and Law & Justice, Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad released the 'Digital North East: Vision 2022' document at Guwahati, in the presence of the Hon'ble Chief Ministers of Assam, Meghalaya and Tripuraand other eminent dignitaries from North Eastern states. Vision 2022 is an ambitious futuristic document aiming at leveraging digital technologies to transform lives of people of the North east and enhancing the ease of living of north-eastern people by bridging the digital divide.

During the event, Hon'ble MoE&IT, Govt. of India also laid foundation stone for four NIELIT permanent centres at Guwahati, Shillong, Lunglei and Gangtok. The event was organized at Guwahati, Assam by NIELIT Guwahati team under supervision of MeitY and NIELIT HQ.

3. Scheme for 'Skill Development in ESDM for Digital India': The scheme is aimed towards facilitating creation of an eco-system for development of ESDM sector through skill development of 3, 28000 persons. This is in continuation of the earlier approved 'Scheme for Financial Assistance to select States/UTs for Skill Development in Electronics System Design and Manufacturing (ESDM) sector' with a target to train 90,000 candidates. Under these ESDM Schemes, skill development training in electronic sector is provided to students and unemployed youth through Training Partners

NIELIT is one of the Key Implementing Agencies on behalf of MeitY: To implement the project, a ESDM-Programme Management Unit (ESDM-PMU) is set-up by MeitYwhich is working under administrative control of NIELIT to monitor the project at ground level.

2.88 Lakh candidates are enrolled and trained, out of which 1.95 Lakh no. of candidates are certified and 16,847 no. of candidates are placed cumulatively in both the schemes till 31st March 2019. The Scheme duration has been extended up to 31.03.2020



- **4. PMGDISHA Programme :** The Pradhan Mantri Gramin digital Saksharta Abhiyan (PMGDISHA) is aimed to empower the citizens of rural areas by training them to operate computer or digital access devices. It is a dynamic and integrated platform of digital literacy awareness, education and capacity building that will help rural communities to fully participate in the global digital economy. Various agencies are involved in training, examination and certification of assessment of candidates under PMGDISHA programme. NIELIT is one of the certifying agency of PMGDISHA scheme and as a part examinations were conducted for 7,66,810 candidates during 2018-2019.
- 5. Workshop on NSQF accreditation scheme: In order to ensure that NIELIT Courses are up to date and

aligned with industry requirements, pro-active measures are being taken to align these courses with government regulation and framework. To achieve the objectives of Skill India Mission, NIELIT has aligned 75 skill development coursesunder National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) (Area-Electronics:43 and Information technology:32) ranging from Level 2 to Level 8. {NSQF is a competency-based quality assurance framework that organizes qualifications in terms of aptitude, knowledge, skills and Learning outcomes;



whether they are obtained through formal, non-formal or informal learning.}

The NSQF Accreditation Scheme was launched in a workshop organized by NIELIT Gorakhpur and Lucknow on 1stJuly, 2018 aimed at spreading awareness about the scheme under which institutes can conduct NIELIT's NSQF aligned courses. The workshop was attended by over 161 participants from various NIELIT Accredited Institutes NCPUL Centres, Colleges & other organizations.

6. Cyber Shiksha for Women: NIELIT Patna and NIELIT Jammu Centre is conducting "Cyber Shiksha" training program exclusively for women and making them Industry ready by imparting the requisite technical skills in the domain of Cyber Security. The program also entails placement assistance for the deserving candidates with the potential recruiters looking to hire for various job roles in Cyber Security. The course is sponsored jointly by Microsoft, CDAC, Data Security Council of India (DSCI) in association with ISEA & Ministry of Electronics & IT (MeitY).

H. WORKSHOP/SEMINAR/TRAINING

- With objective to assist the stakeholders in understanding the regulatory framework of GST and its implication NIELIT Centres are providing training to the respective state government employees. NIELIT Kohima along with the Department of Commerce, Nagaland University, jointly organized a two-day national workshop cum seminar on 'GST in India, on May 22-23, 2018 at NIELIT Kohima. Similar workshop was also conducted by NIELIT Guwahati on 27th February 2019 at NEDFi Convention Centre, Guwahati.
- NIELIT Calicut and State Agricultural Management extension training Institute, Kerala jointly organized a six months training on Advanced Diploma in ICT and Social Media for 25 Agricultural officers of Kerala in April 2018.
- Software Development for Government Organizations: A website was designed & developed for North eastern Regional Institute of Water and Land Management (NERIWALM), a Society under the Ministry of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation, Govt. of India by NIELIT Extension Centre, Tezpur. NIELIT Jammu Centre has designed and developed a website for J&K State Dental Council (JKSDC). This website will ease the registration and renewal procedures of JKSDC and will also bring transparency to the system. NIELIT Agartala has designed and developed a 'School Inspection Portal' (www.schoolinspectiontr.in) for Education



Dept., Tripura for monitoring the condition of government schools in each district of Tripura. The launch event of portal was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister of School and Higher Education, Tripura on 27th September 2018. NIELIT Agartala also developed Placement Portal for Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Tripura and Payroll Management for Sarva Shikshya Abhiyan (SSA), Tripura.

Out of 18 location construction of permanent campuses has been started at 12 locations (Imphal, Senapati & Churachandpur in Manipur; Aizawl & Lunglei in Mizoram; Chuchuyimlang in Nagaland; Pasighat in Arunachal Pradesh; Tezpur, Kokrajhar, Jorhat, Dibrugarh in Assam and Gangtok in Sikkim).

As per recommendations of PRSG in its 7th meeting the Setting up of permanent campus at rest of the six locations viz. Guwahati & Silchar in Assam, Shillong & Tura in Meghalaya and Itanagar, Tezu in Arunachal Pradesh is dropped due to non-availability of land and other related issue.

Further attention is drawn towards Note number 12 of schedule 25 regarding pending reconciliation of tax deducted at source with the form 26 AS issued by income tax department. Further attention is drawn towards Note number 16 of schedule 25 regarding reconciliation differences in case of short term deposits while preparation of receipt & payment account and reconciliation differences between opening and closing of cash & bank balances. Our opinion is not qualified in respect with such matters

In case of NIELIT Delhi Head quarter audited by us there were following Emphasis of matter

Attention is drawn towards note Number 19 of schedule 24 of its standalone financial statements regarding pending updation of fixed assets register. Further attention is drawn towards note 16 of schedule 24 of its standalone financial statements regarding pending reconciliation with inter center accounts with NIELIT Head Quarter and Further attention is drawn towards note 15 of schedule 24 of its standalone financial statements regarding ongoing process of confirmation with Debtors, Creditors, current assets, current liabilities & loans and advances, which are stated in the books at the value which is Recoverable/Payable. Our opinion is not qualified in respect with such matters

In case of Shimla center, Chandigarh center, Itanagar center, New Delhi center, Ropar center, Shilong center, Chennai center, Srinagar and Jammu center, Calicut center, NPR; emphasis of matter is drawn by their auditors towards certain matters, reference to such reports can be made.

Other Matter

We did not audit the financial statements (referred as returns) of Aizawal, Aurangabad, Calicut, Gorakhpur, Imphal, Sri Nagar & Jammu, Guwahati, Kolkata, Chandigarh, Kohima, Chennai, Agartala, Shillong, Gangtok, Ajmer, Roper, Patna, Shimla, Ranchi, New Delhi & Itanagar, as considered in the consolidated financial statements.

These financial statements have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these centres is based solely on the reports of the other auditors.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

The Society Management is responsible for the preparation of these consolidated financial statements in accordance with applicable Law and bye laws for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the consolidated financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

SCHEDULE 24:

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (here-in-after referred as NIELIT), an Autonomous Scientific Society (re-named with effect from 10.10.2011 from DOEACC Society) under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India was set up during November, 1994 to carry out Human Resource Development and related activities in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT). The society is registered with Income Tax Department u/s 12A and has been formed exclusively for the purpose to generate quality manpower and develop skilled professionals in the area of Information, Electronics & Communications Technology (IECT) and allied fields, by providing world class education & training and accreditation services. The Society is engaged both in the formal & Non-formal Education in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT) besides development of Industry oriented quality education and training in the stateof-art areas establish standards to be the Country's premier Institution for Examination and Certification in the field of ICT. It is also a National Examination Body which accredits institutes/organizations for conducting courses particularly in the Non-formal Sector of IT Education & training. NIELIT is working through its 21 centres i.e.- Aizwal, Aurangabad, Agartala, Ajmer, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Delhi, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Itanagar, Imphal, Kolkata, Kohima, Patna, Ranchi, Ropar, Shillong, Shimla and Srinagar & Jammu.

The following policies represent the consolidated accounting policies of NIELIT including its various centers and also include various material information and material notes to accounts specifically mentioned in various center's audited financials becoming part of this consolidated financial statements of NIELIT

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:

a) Method of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and unless otherwise stated below on the accrual method of accounting.

b) <u>Use of Estimates</u>

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amount of revenues of expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialize.

2. **INCOME RECOGNITION**

All the NIELIT Centers are following accrual method of accounting except:

- a) In case of Agartala Centre Income from 'ISEA Project-II and DONER Project are accounted on cash basis.
- b) Ajmer centre has changed the system of accounting from cash system to Mercantile in respect of BCC/CCC share of Exam fee.
- c) Calicut Centre- Income from Student Projects is recognized on completion basis.
- New Delhi Center recognized Grant actually received from Government of India on cash basis.
- e) Imphal & Srinagar/Jammu Center recognized course fees on receipt basis.
- f) Registration Fee, Accreditation Fee, Variable Accreditation Fee (VAF) and Awareness Creation Fund (ACF) have been recognized on receipt basis.
- The revenue Grant-in-Aid released by the MeitY to Centers for meeting of Recurring Expenditure has been accounted as income by respective centers, as detailed below:

4. <u>Investments</u>

Funds of the Society invested in Short Term Fixed Deposits with nationalized banks have been shown as per guidelines of the Society for "Treasury Management of Surplus".

Interest on Fixed Deposit kept for Earmarked/ Endowment Fund received during the year, is being credited to respective Earmarked/ Endowment Fund.



4A. <u>Inventory</u>

In case of Aurangabad Center, it has valued and shown closing stocks of material, components, publications, consumables etc. as per the revised and modified policy of head office New Delhi. The valuation has been made on the basis of cost or net realizable value whichever is lower.

5. Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition. In respect of project involving construction, related pre- operational expenses, form part of the value of the Assets capitalized.

- a) In respect of Calicut Centre, the value of equipment's consisting of 17 numbers of items given as grant to the Centre by UNDP have been shown at a notional value of Rs.1/- on both liability and asset side.
- b) In case of Kolkata centre Fixed Assets are stated at cost (Gross) less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes/cost of acquisition, installation, which is inclusive of freight and duty, taxes, incidental expenses. Leasehold Land for 999 years at Sector 1 of Bidhannagar (Salt Lake, Plot No. 267, Block-BF) has been shown under the head "Building" in the Fixed Asset schedule. Its Fixed Assets register requires updating.
- c) In case of Chandigarh there was a major fire incident in June, 2014 in the building occupied by NIELIT Chandigarh (formerly Regional Computer Centre) at SCO 114-116, Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding losses/write-offs in respect thereof have been recorded in the year 2015-2016. In the said incident, the Centre lost almost all the records till that date, including Fixed Asset Register.
- d) In respect of Agartala Centre, 15 Acres of Land for building the permanent campus has been allotted by Govt. of Tripura at free of cost, the same has been shown at the Nominal Value of Re. 1/-. Under the Fixed Assets Schedule.
- e) The Government of Rajasthan has allotted 16.33 Hectares of land at Village Khoda near KekriDistt. Ajmer for 99 years lease at free of cost has been shown at the nominal value of Re.1/-.
- f) In case of Guwahati center: in respect of NE Capacity Building Project of Silchar& Jorhat Extension Centre,

expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 4 years has been shown as deferred expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy. Further in respect of NIELIT Guwahati (City Centre), expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 10 years has been shown as deferred Expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy.

6. <u>Depreciation</u>

Depreciation is provided on W.D.V. method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961.

Depreciation for current year on "Grant related Assets" is debited to Income & Expenditure Account and also credited to Income & Expenditure Account as per AS-12 and deducted from "Capital Grant-in-Aid" during the year.

7. Government Grants

During the financial year 2018-19 NIELIT has not received GIA (Plan) and (Non Plan) from MeitY.

8. Change in Accounting Policy

During the year no such changes taken place.

9. Employee's Benefits

- Provision for Gratuity is accounted for on actuarial valuation as per AS -15. The liability of Gratuity in respect of Calicut and Chandigarh has been covered by the policy obtained in favor of the respective Employee's Trust under Group Gratuity cash accumulation from LIC of India. NIELIT employees are covered under the existing Gratuity scheme as on 14.12.2002 i.e. on month emoluments (Pay + Grade Pay) for each employee, for each completed year of Service.
- Provision of Leave Encashment is accounted for on actuarial valuation basis as per AS-15.
- Bonus is accounted on Cash Basis.
- NIELIT HQ and Centers have been covered under EPF w.e.f. 01.01.2003 with the approval of the Competent Authority. EPF Contributions from April, 2013 onwards are being deposited with RPFC. The arrears of EPF for the period from 01.01.2003 to 31.03.2013 has been deposited with EPF Office. The balance lying in NIELIT CPF, is being reconciled.
- NIELIT has adopted NPS Scheme for regular employees, joined after 1st September, 2014.

- NIELIT Chandigarh initiated arbitration proceedings against Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) for recovery of dues amounting Rs. 15,66,021 for providing instructors for School project, appropriate provision in respect of which had already been made in the books as Provision for Doubtful Debts. KVS not
- has only refuted the claim of the centre but has also filed a counter claim of Rs. 2,68,650/- as over payment of the Centre (formerly RCC). Arbitration proceedings are yet to be concluded.
- ESI had issued demand notice for Rs. 11,22,702/- and Rs. 3,03,947/- for non-compliance of ESI Scheme for the period from Oct 2002 to March 2003. Dy Director,



ESI vide Order No. PB.17000399790001013/245 dated 21.07.2011 has directed the Centre for payment of the demand. However, the centre has preferred an appeal and accordingly Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No. 5441 of 2013 and CWP No. 5367 of 2013 are pending with Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, though the Hon'ble High Court has granted stay against the recovery of demand as an interim relief.

Against the orders of Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal dated 2nd May,2014, this Centre filed Civil Writ Petition No. 15204 of 2014 before Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court Chandigarh for recovery of balance amount of wrongly drawn HRA with penal interest amounting to Rs. 3,89,642.00 by Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex. Data Entry Operator 'E'. Proceedings in the matter are in process. The said amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- was recovered from the amount of leave encashment payable on her retirement. Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex-Data Entry operator 'E' of this Centre has again filed O.A. No. 60/129/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh Bench for release of withheld amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- and proceedings are under process.

Till such time the matter is decided by Hon'ble, the said amount of Rs.3,89,642/- has been treated as Contingent liabilities.

- This Centre had rendered Consultancy Services to the Rajasthan State Co-Operative Bank Jaipur for procurement of Hardware Infrastructure for which this Centre received advance of Rs. 17.15 Lacs. The Rajasthan State Co-Operative Bank Jaipur did not finally place the supply order and has filed Recovery Suit No. 60/2007 before the Hon'ble Additional District and Session Judge, Fast Track 13, Jaipur City claiming Rs. 23.58 Lacs (Rs.17.15 plus Rs. 6.43 Lacs as interest). The case has been transferred from Additional District and Session Judge Fast Track —13, Jaipur City to Hon'ble Court of Sr. Judge, Commercial Court 1 and thereafter to Commercial Court 2, Jaipur Metropolitan Jaipur, the proceedings are in process.
- A sum of Rs. 43,24,045/- was shown recoverable against Municipal Corporation Chandigarh against Land allotted vide letter No. MC/ESTATE/2002/4732 dated 29-01-2002 which was subsequently surrendered by the Centre. In the absence of any relief provided by Chief Administrator, Chandigarh and UT Administration, Chandigarh, writ petition was filed before the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, which was also dismissed

in default, against which, another writ petition was filed for restoration of the case. The said Writ petition was also dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file afresh on the same cause of action. Based upon the representation sent to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh regarding re-consideration for allotment of land at Manimajra by adjusting initial payment of Rs.43.24 lacs already released by this Centre in favour of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh and non-applicability of demand note raised towards interest on delayed payment of premium, Ground Rent and forfeiture amount of consideration money, fresh Writ Petition has been filed through Central Govt. Counsel. Appropriate provision had already been made in the books of accounts of the Centre in this regard.

- Sh.Itwari, Safaiwala (MTS) has filed OANo. 60/294/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Principal Bench, Chandigarh for release of salary for the absence period from October, 2012 to April, 2013 and July, 2013 to March, 2014. He had falsely claimed the salary for the entire period of absence from October, 2012 to April, 2013 and July, 2013 to March, 2014 stating that he was present during the above said period. Detailed exercise had been made to reconcile the various records/Bank Statement of his bank account. His salary arrears for 13 days of October, 2012, 2 days of December, 2012 and 9 days of April, 2013, after recovery for 7 days of September, 2012 has been released. Reply has been filed before the Hon'ble CAT and proceedings are under process.
 - Sh. V. K. Jain, Ex Director In charge, NIELIT Chandigarh along with fifteen other Ex- employees of NIELIT Chandigarh who retired after 01.01.2016 and before 29.03.2018 i.e. the date of issue of Gazette Notification by Ministry of Labour and Employment, Govt. of India vide which maximum amount of gratuity payable to an employee under "The Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972" has been increased from Rs. 10 lacs to Rs. 20 lacs., have filed O.A. No. 60/1144/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Principal Bench, Chandigarh for grant of revised gratuity to the applicants @ maximum of Rs. 20 lacs along with interest @ 12% p.a. from respective dates of retirements of the applicants till the actual date of realization. Reply on behalf of Respondents was filed before the Hon'ble CAT. Further Proceedings are under process.

b) Kolkata Centre

i. RCC Employees Contributory Provident Fund Trust



with Income Tax recognition ismaintaining PF of employees who have joined NIELIT before 01.01.2004. However, PF of employees who have joined on or after 01.01.2004 is maintained at NIELIT Head Quarter under EPR & MP Act, 1952. The centre has received a notice on 11.07.2006 and order u/s. 7A dt. 09.07.2008 and u/s 7B dt. 30.01.2009 from Regional EPF authority that NIELIT will cover under EPF & MP Act. 1952 from August 1982. Against the above-mentioned orders, the centre has filed an appeal to the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi (appropriate authority) that our Head Quarter is covered under CPF Act. 1925 as per Gol Gazette Notification dt. 26.07.1997. However, the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi has dismissed the appeal by order dated 3rd August, 2011. The Centre has there after filed on appeal with the Honourable High Court, Kolkata against the aforesaid order, on 21st March, 2012. The said appeal is still pending.

NIELIT Kolkata has paid a sum of Rs. 1,56,854/-under protest against demand of Rs. 6,27,413/- from Employees' State Insurance Corporation West Bengal Region. The demand has been disputed by the Centre.

ii. There is contingent liability of service tax for Rs. 9,82,620/- (Rs. 4,87,425/- for Cenvat Credit availed on common input service for which assessment is pending till Balance Sheet date and Rs. 4,95,195/- under Rule 6(3) and Rule 14 of CCR Rules, 2004 for which Appeal is pending with Service Tax Authority out of which Rs. 4,95,195/- was set aside by the Commissioner of CGST & C. Ex, Howrah Commission rate vide his order no. 219/S. Tax-11/Ko1/2018 dt. 20.03.18.

Rs. 2,50,81,223/- has been paid on account of Service Tax on self-assessment basis and booked as expenses during the current year i.e. 2019-20. However, some

interest or penalty may be imposed by Service Tax Department which presently cannot be quantified.

Further, NIELIT has charged Service Tax on the services provided to Department of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh in the earlier years when such services were exempted from Service Tax, for this amount of Service Tax paid to the Service Tax Department an appeal for the refund has been filed with the authorities.

- ii) Services provided to Director Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh was considered as exempted from GST till October, 2018 and after that GST was collected and paid to the Department of GST. So, there may be liability on account of GST for the period from April, 2018 to October, 2018.
- iii) There are certain GST payments during the F.Y. 2018-19 under its GSTIN where GST amount was less paid or paid delayed along with the late fee as calculated by GSTN but interest as prescribed under section 50(1) of GST Act, 1961 has not been paid/accrued by the centre/in the books respectively, and the amount will be paid along with tax wherever applicable as and when demanded by the Authorities as final payment on cash paid basis.

d) NIELIT (HQ)

Service Tax amounting Rs. 46,00,770/- and Interest on service tax Rs. 45,94,626/- has been paid by the NIELIT (HQ) during the FY 2018-19 on ACCR Fee for the period pertaining to FY 2013-14 to FY 2015-16 and on sale of Exam Forms pertaining to FY 2013-14 to FY 2015-16 on account of demand raised by the Service Tax Audit..

2. <u>Capital Commitment:</u>

- Building is constructed at Lunglei extension Centre and at Aizawl centre, total estimated construction cost is Rs 19,22,21,002/-out of which Rs 12,58,48,234/- has been paid till 31.03.2019.
- b) In case of HQs, Office space at NBCC Tower, Kidwai Nagar is being purchased for Rs.47.01 crores out of which Rs. 45.55 crores have been paid till 31st March,2019.
- NIELIT Bhawan for housing HQ has been constructed at Dwarka, Delhi. Total Estimated Cost is Rs. 52.69 Crores out of which Rs. 44.05 Crores has been paid till 31st March, 2019.
- d) During the year, Building Maintenance Fund has been created with the cost Rs. 28,74,93,652/- of Building appearing in the Fixed Assets Schedule. The same funds have been transferred from Earmarked Funds to Building Maintenance Fund.



3. <u>Current Assets, Current liabilities, Provisions and Loans and Advances</u>

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realizable in the ordinary course of business, except in the case of debtors where provision for Bad & doubtful debts provided for.

a) In Case of Delhi Centre

A Provision of Rs. 1,07,04,323/- for doubtful debts has been made in respect of sundry debtors (Apart from stated below) which are outstanding for more than three years. (i.e. before 31.03.2016) which in the opinion of the management is reasonable.

A provision of Rs. 30,25,941/- has been made towards doubtful debts against recoverable of Rs. 1,21,71,327/- from Director of Education, Jhandewalan. This amount is due since 2004-05. The matter is under arbitration. An arbitrator gave an Award dated 27.12.2017 for an amount of Rs. 78,98,437/- and interest @ 8% p.a. w.e.f.23.03.2011 till the date of payment on the above amount to NIELIT by Directorate of Education. In the opinion of the management quantum of provision made is reasonable.

b) <u>In case of Chandigarh Centre</u>

i) Debtors

The Chandigarh Centre is having Debtors of Rs. 1606.07 lacs, out of which Rs. 550.02Lacs are outstanding for more than 3 years. The debtors outstanding relates to even for the Financial Year 2005-06 and before that. During the audit, it has been found that some urgent steps for recovery/monitoring need to be taken which was stressed upon in auditor's report for F.Y. 2017-18 also. However, as the management is of the opinion-that debtors are either from government departments or from public sector undertakings and are recoverable, and which includes existing parties also, so assessment for provision of doubtful debts could not be made.

ii) Grant-in-Aid:

Chandigarh Centre has not maintained any sub-ledgers or separate register for the receipt and utilization of various grants as envisaged under the grant sanction/disbursement letters.

The amount outstanding as on 31/03/19 is Rs.676.55

Lacs. It includes the amount related to projects already completed. At the time of utilization of grants, these amounts were not appropriated out of specific grants. A relevant adjustment entry needs to be passed so that the amount spent/unspent be shown properly as per the accounting system.

iii) Amount Recoverable:

Work contract tax (WCT) being deducted by PSEB/ PSPCL for long is without any legal sanction. An amount aggregating to Rs.48.58 lacs is reflected as recoverable as on 31st March, 2019.In this respect legal opinion needs to be sought and matter needs to be sorted out on urgent basis to recover the dues.

iv) Security with Government Departments:

Certain old outstanding security deposits made with different government departments amounting to Rs. 6.92Lacs are due/overdue for refund/recovery. Urgent necessary steps being taken for appropriate action in this regard.

v) Balance Confirmation/Reconciliation:

Party Accounts including debtors, creditors, advance received from students and others etc. remained subject to confirmation, reconciliation necessary adjustment consequent to reconciliation. Impact thereof, consequent to the said confirmation/reconciliation, on the income/ expenditure of the current /previous year(s) and assets/ liabilities, if any, is unascertainable.

As the Centre is working with Govt. Deptts. / Autonomous bodies, so in the opinion of the management, old receivables, which are not provided for or written off, are hopeful of recovery. However, the balances remained unconfirmed as on 31st March, 2019.

- Amounts aggregating to Rs.3,24,863.10 received during the year from debtors could not be credited to the appropriate debtor's account for want of relevant information. The said consolidated amount has been reduced from total debtors.
- ii. NIELIT Shimla has been declared as Independent Centre vide NIELIT HQ Office Order No.SHM (01)2017-NIELIT (Civil)/01/7304 dated 27.12.2018. Consequently, Grant in aid of Rs.4,79,218.00 equal to the WDV of Fixed Assets (as on 01.04.2018) acquired with Grant-in-aid has been transferred from NIELIT



Chandigarh to NIELIT Shimla. The value of Fixed Assets was already being shown in the books of accounts of NIELIT Shimla.

iii. Rs.2,57,970.50 has been deducted by Debtors on account of TDS under GST but the credit will be availed on receipt of details from the user departments.

c) In case of HQ

Delhi Development Authority has allotted a plot measuring 4277.88 sq. mtr to NIELIT at Sector 8, Dwarka, New Delhi for construction of its HQ's. Final Cost of the land is yet to be finalized by DDA.

d) During the Financial Year 2016-17, Shillong centre had given an amount of Rs. 2,86,50,000/- to Project Management Consultant (PMC) as 'Mobilization Advance' as per agreement executed between NIELIT and PMC under the project entitled "Development of North-Eastern Region by enhancing the training/ education capacity in the IECT area".

e) <u>In case of Srinagar & Jammu</u>

- i. An amount of Rs.4,00,19,633/- being Central Provident Fund Surplus and Interest is credited to the Profit & Loss Account. The same has been explained to the auditor being the previous excess contribution and interest thereon, kept in Fixed Deposit, which is now monitored at the Head Office level. Therefore, the amount being credited to the Profit & Loss Account as the same was found in excess of Liability of CPF due to employees of Society.
- ii. The amount of GST Input Receivables of Rs. 3,42,78,269.22/- which is added to the cost of the project being part of it is shown no longer recoverable. The view has been taken because of the fact that it cannot be recovered from the purchaser i.e. J&K State Govt. as the agreement was made before the commencement of GST Act with J&K State.

f.) In case of Aizwal

The balance of Duty & Taxes as on 31.03.2019 Worth Rs. 72,61,512/- shown under the head "Current Assets Loans & Advances etc." The nature of such amount in input tax credit arising due to Construction of Building under NECB Project. The matter is to be reviewed.

g.) In case of Aurangabad Centre

- i) It is informed that there is an excess receipt from CSAB Jaipur of Rs. 5,20,000/- in the Financial Year 2014-15 the details of such receipts are not available and same is treated as current liability, necessary action in the matter required.
- ii) From the accounts it is noted that in respect to TDS Receivable accounts there are very old balances from financial year 2009-10 to 2017-18 and necessary entries are required to be passed Total amount is Rs. 1,02,23,190. Further no appropriation of such amount done at Head office. It is suggested to transfer such amounts to Head Office account since Income Tax Return are filed by the Head Office.
- iii) Advance GIA (Panchayati Raj Project) account under the head current liabilities balance of which Rs. 9,35,734/- received for the specified purpose on 31st August 2015 however same is not utilized neither refunded back till 31st March 2019.

h) <u>In case of Ajmer</u>

Amount of Rs.4,21,820/- shown as 'Accrued income 0 level under Current Assets were pending since F.Y 2015-16.

i) <u>In Case of Shimla</u>

Declaration of NIELIT Shimla as Independent Centre &handover of cases relating to Service tax refund claim:

NIELIT Shimla has been declared as Independent Centre vide NIELIT HQ Office Order No.SHM(01)2017-NIELIT (Civil)/01/7304 dated 27.12.2018. As per the order, books of accounts of NIELIT Shimla will be managed independently w.e.f. 01.04.2018 and Balance sheet of current financial year shall be prepared by NIELIT Centre, Shimla separately. Consequently, the Balance sheet & Income & Expenditure Account of NIELIT Chandigarh have been made standalone (excluding NIELIT Shimla), while the previous year figures are consolidated figures of NIELIT Chandigarh, Shimla & Kurukshetra.

Consequent to the above order, cases seeking refund of Service tax of Rs.74.86 lacs and Rs.257.78 lacs relating to HP School Project filed before CESTAT have been handed over to NIELIT Shimla for further action.

5. <u>National Population Register (NPR)</u>

(a) Contingent Liabilities:

In case of Chandigarh Centre

i) Arbitration Petition was filed by M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi. In addition to the payment due to M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited, the MSP has demanded interest @18%. The amount of interest specified in their petition for Zone -61,Uttar Pradesh is Rs 2,32,69,467/- and Zone -62,

Uttar Pradesh is Rs 1,79,62,692/- which were under jurisdiction of NIELIT Chandigarh.In addition to the interest amount, MSP is also demanding cost towards renewal of Bank Guarantee.Arbitrator has already been appointed in the case. Mediation proceedings were held on 24.08.2018 & failed. Statement of Defense against the statement of Claim submitted by M/S SREI infrastructure Finance Ltd has been filed by the Respondent i.e. NIELIT. Further proceedings are in process.

(ii) M/s Virgo Softech Limited, New Delhi has filed



Arbitration Petitions for appointment of Arbitrator in respect to agreements signed by M/S Virgo Softech Limited with NIELIT Chandigarh for Demographic Data Digitization of National Population Register (NPR) Project. In the said petitions, the MSP has mentioned about non-applicability of deduction of Rs 3,36,76,262/- made by the NIELIT towards delay in the execution of work and has challenged levy of said penalty on the pretext that that work has been completed by them in time. The Deputy Secretary, MeitY had conveyed vide letter dated 15'th October ,2018 that Ministry has appointed Arbitrator to resolve the dispute between NIELIT and M/S Virgo Softech Limited and the Hon'ble High Court was apprised accordingly. The petitions filed by M/S Virgo Softech have been dismissed by the Hon'ble High Court on 30.11.2018.

In case of Gorakhpur Centre

NIELIT Gorakhpur Centre is respondent in the matter of arbitration between M/s SREI Infrastructure Finance Ltd. and NIELIT before Hon'ble Arbitration Tribunal of Sole Arbitrator against claim of Rs. 7,24,77,407/-

(b) <u>Current Assets, Loans and Advances:</u>

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realised in the ordinary course of business.

- (c) Department of Electronics, Information & Technology vide its letter bearing No: FNo7(2)2011-EG-1 dated 05/04/2011 has entrusted the work of Demographic Data Digitisation & Bio-metric data collection for creating National Population Register (NPR) in respect of 17 States & 2 Union Territories. RGI vide its DO No;9/83/2010-CRD(NPR) dated 27.06.2012 has withdrawn the work of Bio-Metric data digitisation from NIELIT.
- (d) Office of the Registrar General of India had released an advance of Rs 522.24 crore to the NIELIT for execution of National Population Register Project. Total cost towards Data Digitisation (NPR Project) stands at approx. Rs 569 crore.
- (e) The work of Data digitisation has been completed. The last Digitised Data has been handed over to RGI during October, 2013. However, payment to MSP's (Managed Service Provider) could not be made earlier, because NIELIT had imposed penalty as per the terms of RFQ (Request for Quotation) against the bills submitted by MSP's, which was disputed by MSP's. Further the work of LRUR (Local Register of Usual Residents) correction

was also withdrawn by RGI(Registrar General of India). The matter relating to settlement of penalty and LRUR correction cost were taken up before the competent authority of NIELIT. The competent authority had accorded approval, as under:

- (i) That the payments be released to MSP's in a transparent and accountable manner after deduction of LRUR correction cost, which has been quantified @ 4.3% of the digitised rate quoted by the MSP's.
- (ii) The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections to be returned back to RGI.
- (iii) To revise the agreement signed with MSP's on account of change in the scope of work and also terms and conditions related to payment because of withdrawal of LRUR.
- (f) In accordance with the decisions of the competent authority, the cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections have been accounted for under sub head Liabilities-LRUR (NPR) under "Current Liabilities and Provisions".
- (g) Interest amounting to Rs 271.15 Crore Earned/ Accrued on unutilised Advance has been earmarked under Liabilities and not accounted for as Interest Income in the absence of guild lines from RGI.
- (h) Separate Books of Accounts have been maintained by all the NPR participating NIELIT Centres w.e.f 01.04.2012 in respect of NPR Project & prepared separate Annual Account from the FY 2012-2013.
- 6. We hereby confirm that the society is not having any amount payable to any party covered under micro, small & medium enterprises as defined in section 7(1) of the micro small & medium enterprises Act, 2006, to the extent such parties identified on the basis of information collected by the management.
- 7. Debtors & Creditors, loans and advances, current assets and current liabilities are stated in the books at the value which is recoverable/ payable. However, the confirmation from the parties are under process.
- 8. Figures have rounded off to the nearest Rupee.
- 9. Previous Year Figures have been regrouped/reclassified, wherever necessary to make it comparable from the parties are under process.
- 10. During consolidation of various centres, heading/groups has been re-arranged for better and fair presentation.



- 11. Only material notes as per the understanding of the management in relation to various centre's audited financial statements have been presented in these consolidated financial statements, for non-material notes a reference can be made to individual centre audited financial statements.
- NIELIT is in the process of reconciliation of its tax deducted at source with the form 26 AS issued by income tax department for the year ended 31st March, 2019.

- In accordance with the Office Order No.01(08)2016-NIELIT(Civil)/Vol.VI/9311 dtd. 01.01.2019, NIELIT Chandigarh has shifted its operations from C-134, PUNCOM Building, Phase VIII, Industrial Area, S.A.S. Nagar (Mohali) to Campus at Birla farms, Bada Phull,

- Ropar (Punjab) in April, 2019, keeping a few activities of UT Chandigarh at hired space of IETE Campus, Sector 30, Chandigarh.
- Further, on a fateful day of 18th August, 2019, Office
 Building at Ropar was engulfed under the impact of
 floods damaging Building, Hardware, Furniture &
 Fixtures, Electrical & Air conditioning equipment &
 connections, vehicles etc. The Centre is in process
 of assessing the loss. Therefore, its impact on the
 Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account is
 yet to be ascertained.
- 15. The statutory audit of Pali Extension Centre for the year has been conducted with the audit of Ajmer Centre. The transaction made at Pali Extension centre have duly been merged with NIELIT Ajmer Centre in the financial statement of the Centre from the F.Y. 2018-19.
- 16. Centers do not follow the streamline policy in preparation of receipt and payment accounts in case of short term deposits resulting into certain reconciliation differences between closing balances of short term deposits appearing in balance sheets and in the receipt & payment account as at 31-3-2019. Further there are certain reconciliation differences between opening and closing cash & bank balances in the Receipt & Payment account as at 31.3.2019.
